From the Pastor...

THE PEACE OF CHRIST

In his last conversation with his disciples, Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let your hearts not be troubled, neither let them be afraid." (John 14:27)

In Philippians 4:7, the apostle Paul advises a beloved congregation and then blesses them with these words, "the peace of God which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

Both the Worship committee and the Session have had lively discussions this month about the "passing of the peace" in worship. When members of a congregation "pass the peace", they are blessing each other with this prayer. They are asking God to bless the person to whom they are speaking with courage, strength, wholeness and a sense of internal well-being which is more than we can understand, deserve, or find through our life's circumstances.

According to the Book of Order, there are three times during a worship service when this verbal exchange among worshippers is particularly appropriate: 1) just after the confession and assurance of pardon, 2) in the approach to the Sacrament of Holy Communion, or 3) as part of the service's ending as members are being sent out of worship and into their daily lives.

In sharing or passing the peace, one person offers the greeting, "The peace of Christ be with you." The response is simply, "And also with you." Some congregations have expanded the peace to include a moment of welcome, exchange of personal news, handshakes, and hugs. These additions to the peace are generally developed over time by a community and reflect a congregation's particular culture and norms.

It was the recommendation of the worship committee that we reinstitute the passing of the peace as a part of our worship service. The discussion at Session suggested to me that we do this as a verbal exchange. Hopefully, this can be a moment for individual blessing of one another. The blessing is not just an announcement by the worship leader, but a sincere prayer we each offer for each other.

If you come from a tradition that did not include this as part of the worship service, I hope you'll participate with us. It you come from a tradition that used the passing of the peace as a general welcome, I hope you'll respect and appreciate the way in which we plan to include it in worship at United. If it feels awkward, give yourself time to get used to it. You are welcome to discuss this with members of the worship committee, Session or me. My hope is that we can appreciate this moment of blessing as part of our worship ritual.




