From the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

Happy Anniversary! It's been great fun to hear your stories as we're preparing for our congregation's 20th anniversary. It's also been a privilege to be among those who do not know your history but are learning fast.

On June 28, 1998, First Presbyterian Church and Hammond Avenue Presbyterian Church held concurrent congregational meetings to vote on a proposed Plan for Union. The effective date of the merger would be October 4, 1998, at which time a new, merged congregation, United Presbyterian Church of Superior, Wisconsin would come into existence. And, as is often said, "The rest is history."

On the first weekend in October, we will remember, give thanks for, and celebrate that history. A lot has happened in twenty years—Many members of Itasca Presbyterian Church transferred in. A new building was planned and built. The Rev. Dr. Henry Hanna left, the Rev. Duane Aslyn served as interim, and the Rev. Joel Huenemann served the congregation for almost 14 years before retiring. Georgia Raun and Alex Sandor have provided music for our worship since before the very beginning.

An anniversary like this gives a congregation an opportunity to record its memories. It is also an opportunity for those who have joined since the merger to learn about our congregation's beginnings.

Additionally, anniversaries can be a time to examine the present and anticipate the future. This is particularly true here at United where the anniversary falls in the midst of a pastoral transition.

Saturday evening we will gather for an anniversary meal and celebration at UWS Yellow Jacket Union. Social hour (with cash bar) will begin at 5:00, a buffet meal will begin at 6:00 and there will be a program to follow. David Waite has volunteered to collate and present your memories and comments. Peace & Global Witness Offering

"So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near."

Enhesians 2:14-17

The letter to the Ephesians tells us that Jesus came to proclaim a peace that is universal. While the earthly ministry of Jesus was in a specific age and place, the peace he shared is limited by neither time nor geography. As followers of Christ, our call to witness/work for peace begins in our own neighborhoods and extends to the ends of the earth. It is a demanding call, but it is one that Presbyterians at all levels of the church are seeking to follow.

At United Presbyterian, we will receive and dedicate this special offering on September 30.

At the national level, this witness is done in direct support of those working to heal the divisions in violent contexts like South Sudan. It means creating educational materials to help congregations deal with more immediate issues, from disagreements between members of session to bullying to gun violence. It means bringing leaders together who have made a profound witness for peace around the world and deploying them as a resource to congregations.

Yet the Offering is as much about local congregations proclaiming Christ's peace. Twenty-five percent of the Offering stays in local congregations and 25 percent is retained by mid councils. Each congregation and mid council decides what peacemaking might be in their local context.

The Peace & Global Witness Offering sustains a witness in many forms and at every level of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), but all are bound together in Christ. Together they are a living proclamation of the peace we know in Christ, who puts an end to hostilities and speaks peace to those near and far.
