Summer's Growth

Happy Summer! Vacations, beach days, flowers, and growing gardens. I enjoy life with you here at United Presbyterian Church—you are a committed, compassionate group of folks who know how to have fun together, care for each other, and voice concerns for the world in which we live.

Summer is a good time to think about how each of us can help grow our congregation. Studies indicate overwhelmingly that most people connect with a congregation because a friend invited them. Most studies conclude that between 75 and 90% of congregational members credit a friend's invitation as the beginning of their relationship with a community of faith.

Invitations don't need to be limited to Sunday morning worship. Community meals, softball games, UPC kids, men's breakfast, and other events are all opportunities to introduce your friends to United Presbyterian Church. Sunday morning invitations can be a little easier to offer in the summer —life is a little more casual and laid back, and often others in the congregation are bringing family members or out of town guests. (Most guests are more comfortable when there are other visitors as well.)

We need your thinking about how we can take United Presbyterian's presence into the community. Church growth is no longer a matter of having a great program or a great pastor and expecting people to show up. Growing churches find ways to move their presence out of the building into places where people are gathered. If you have suggestions about where and how UPC can "show up", please talk with Cameron Campbell or Pastor Charlotte.

Sometimes it's easier to invite someone if we have a specific event in mind. We already know that October 7 we will be celebrating UPC's 20th anniversary. It's not too early to start inviting folks—and we'll even provide postcards for you to send or give to former members, neighbors and friends. Cameron Campbell is on the church session and is chairing a committee whose task is to raise the visibility of United Presbyterian Church in the community and encourage members of the congregation to invite and welcome new comers. Important Information for Medicare Beneficiaries with Limited Income

DID YOU KNOW there are programs available to help pay for your Medicare costs? Medicare Savings Programs assist people with Medicare who have limited income and resources. If eligible, your Medicare Part B premium would be paid for and you would automatically qualify for low cost prescriptions. That savings would be over \$100 per month. Another program known as "Extra Helps" assists qualified individuals with their prescription drug costs.
