Angelou, in this beautiful excerpt of her poem, is writing about her experience as a black woman in America. I'm convinced her words have many things to teach us, but one such thing is that God is moving all things towards justice, truth, and equality out of pain and hurt. God is moving each and every person toward those things, where we may sit at tables together before our God. When we get it wrong, when we trod on others, shoot with words, cut with eyes, or kill with hate, God is still moving us to that reality. Thank God for that because of Christ's birth, life, death, and resurrection... All: We are all forgiven. Amen.
